

Effective means of measuring the volumes, cost & time associated with e-discovery activities







Collecting Data: Practical Tips

- Good enough is perfect
- Use metrics as indicators
- Identify trends over time

- Ask vendors for reports
 - Standard reports per case
 - Cumulative reports per quarter/year


